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Library Orientation Survey 2017

To better understand student needs, the Lesley University Library administered a short survey to incoming first-years at summer orientation. Our freshmen are tech-savvy and passionate about learning, but many are anxious about college-level research and writing.

SAMPLE AND RESPONSE

59% response rate

176 of approximately 300 reported Orientation attendees. Students took the survey, met with librarians, and received a small tech-themed gift.

Students have varying levels of experience with the types of resources and services offered by the library. Notably, the data suggest that previous experience does not necessarily correlate with confidence or comfort. 81% of respondents specified one or more areas of concern or anxiety.
