PRESIDENT WHITE'S MESSAGE

Life at Lesley continues to move at a brisk pace. Each year finds your college expanding in numbers and offerings. More girls are graduated; more alumnae, from pre-college days, return for their degree and to do refresher work. We all are busier than in any preceding period. Thus the news is exciting and colorful. But the best Lesley headlines for 1949 (in case you missed the announcements in the various city newspapers) concern the Trustees' recent purchase of the Cambridge Lower School on nearby Concord Avenue.

A famous private school since 1909 (Lesley's own founding year) Cambridge Lower consists of pre-primary-through-grade-eight standard day school with an enrollment of 120 children, plus a remedial school of 40 children. A combined faculty of 28 teachers serves these two schools which have been re-named by the Board of Trustees the Lesley-Ellis School (in honor of Miss Harriet A. Ellis, - head for the past thirty years and a Lesley Trustee) and the Walter F. Dearborn School (to honor Lesley's one-time Trustee-Board Chairman and present faculty member). Both schools will become, in the fall, laboratory units for the college. They will be presently used by our undergraduates for observation and practice teaching before they begin their student teaching in neighboring communities.

The plant of these schools includes six buildings on an acre and a quarter of land within a few minutes' walk of our Everett

Street campus. Two of the structures contain the schools; two will become dormitories for our college girls; and a shop building and a storage building complete the property which also has two fenced-in playgrounds. The educational and professional advantages of these new schools to Lesley need not be dilated upon here. They give our college opportunities not now available to any other college in New England.

You will want to know, I am sure, how we are progressing, otherwise. For example, we have dropped our two-year course to meet increasing standards and professional requirements. Our enrollment for next fall will be the largest in our history: 325-350 full-time undergraduates with a full-time faculty of 20 seasoned instructors. Such expansion means considerable rearrangement of our facilities hence, alumnae returning next fall for the annual graduate tea and reception will be more than ordinarily interested in the various physical changes. Our plant is now in excellent condition inside and out with many improvements and renovations calculated to meet our challenging growth with appropriate efficiency on our fortieth anniversary next September.

Lesley is grateful for the cooperation of its Alumnae Association which is responsible for directing 20 to 30 new girls each year toward enrollment in our freshman class. The college further appreciates the annual alumnae scholarship which for three years has helped a Lesley girl to continue her education.

For these and other instances of a splendid relationship between the college and the alumnae, I am personally and officially pleased to say, whole-heartedly, thank you, loyal Lesley daughters.
