












I wanted to have a college experience to expand my horizons for the future. I wanted to be independent and make friends. It was scary at first, but I did make new friends, more than I can list!

Threshold was a great program to come to. It helped so much with my academics, my social life and so much more. I really love this program and the independence it has given to me.






Wow it's amazing how fast two years at The Threshold Program goes by! I was a little nervous at first because the longest time I had been away from home was a week at a running camp.


"Something is always happening, but when it happens people don't always see it, or understand it, or accept it."
