## **Historical Note**

The Ph.D. Programs is a division of Lesley University that awards doctoral degrees.

The planning process for the Ph.D. Programs began in 1982 and was predominately driven by a group of faculty members lead by George E. Hein. As stated in the Advanced Graduate Council records, the program was meant to build upon the existing strengths of the Lesley curriculum and to fill a need that was present in the educational community. In 1987, the Lesley Graduate School admitted its first seven students into three different doctoral programs. These programs

were Counseling Psychology, Expressive Therapy, and Leadership in Education and Human Services.

Today, the program has grown to offer two doctoral degrees, in Educational Studies and Expressive Therapies, to over sixty-five students. Students of the Educational Studies program can choose to specialize in either Adult Learning, Educational Leadership, or design their own individual program.
