INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS CLUB

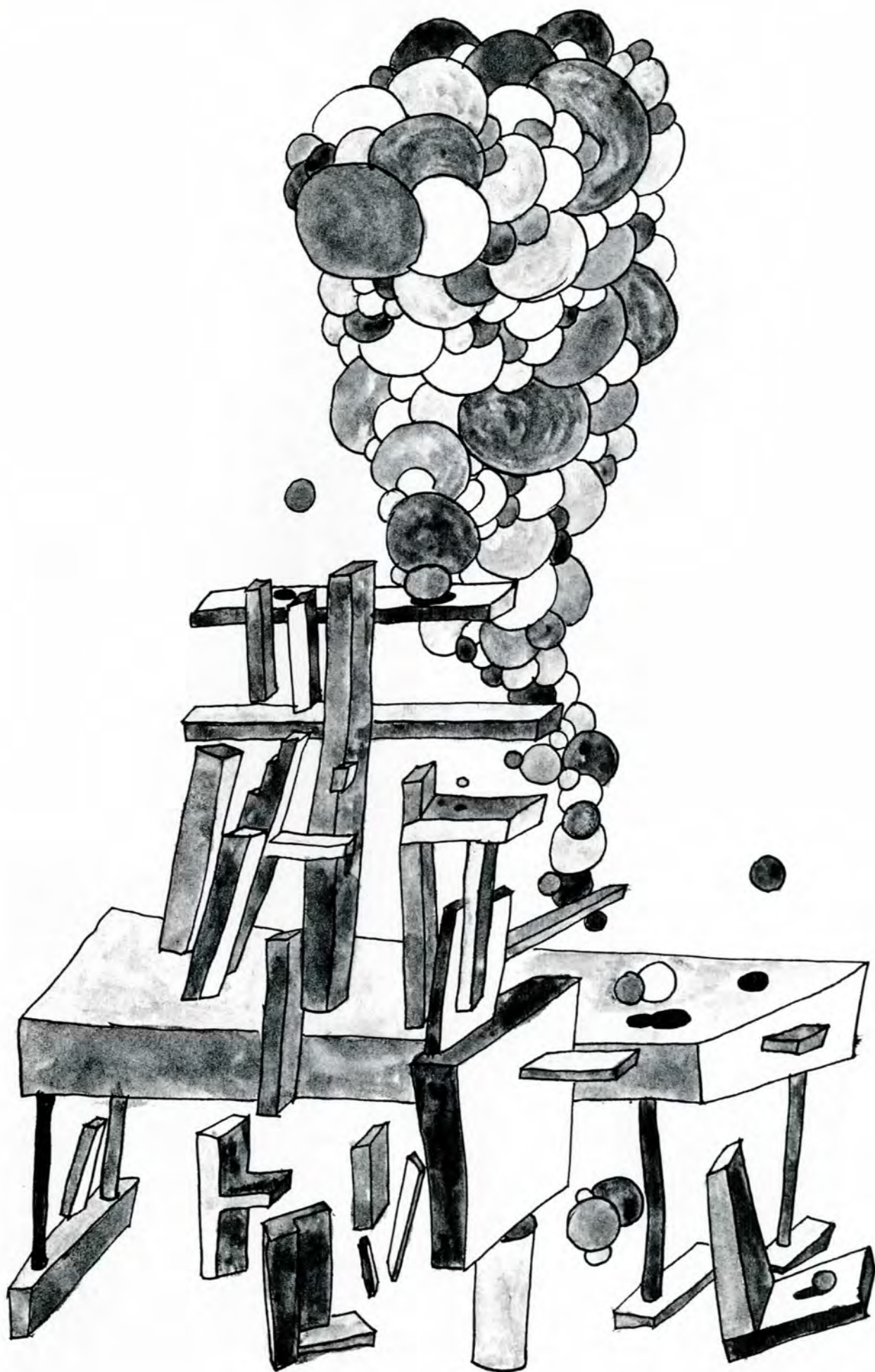

LESLEY COLLEGE— Past, Present, Future

Lesley College was established as the Lesley School in 1909, for the preparation of young women teachers for Kindergarten and the primary grades. In accord with the school's constant development and maturity in scope and function, the initial two-year program was expanded to three and finally to a four year period of preparation for the degree of Bachelor of Science in Education. Now Lesley graduates can teach nursery school and the intermediate grades as well as the kindergarten and primary levels. There is also a co-educational Graduate School of Education that confers Masters' degrees.

Lesley's metamorphosis has been almost total since its conception. The lovely Assembly Room of old, now houses the library. The entrance hall looks much the same, minus the foliage. However, today, hundreds of girls pass through it daily and climb the stairs to the rooms in the newer classroom building. The four-acre main campus consists of nineteen buildings employed as classrooms, administrative and faculty offices, a gymnasium, two libraries, a dining hall, an infirmary, and dormitory living space. These facilities help shape the character and life of the college. Winston Churchill said, "We shape our buildings and then our buildings shape us." The students, faculty, administration, and trustees are working with different aspects of the Lesley Community so as to better shape all areas of college endeavors.

Development and change are not rapid in their progression. The new Lesley College campus will take years to complete. When the day arrives that it is an actuality, it will be a new, modern campus, but not static. It will be flexible enough to change with the constant and inevitable progress in the field of Education and in the world around us.

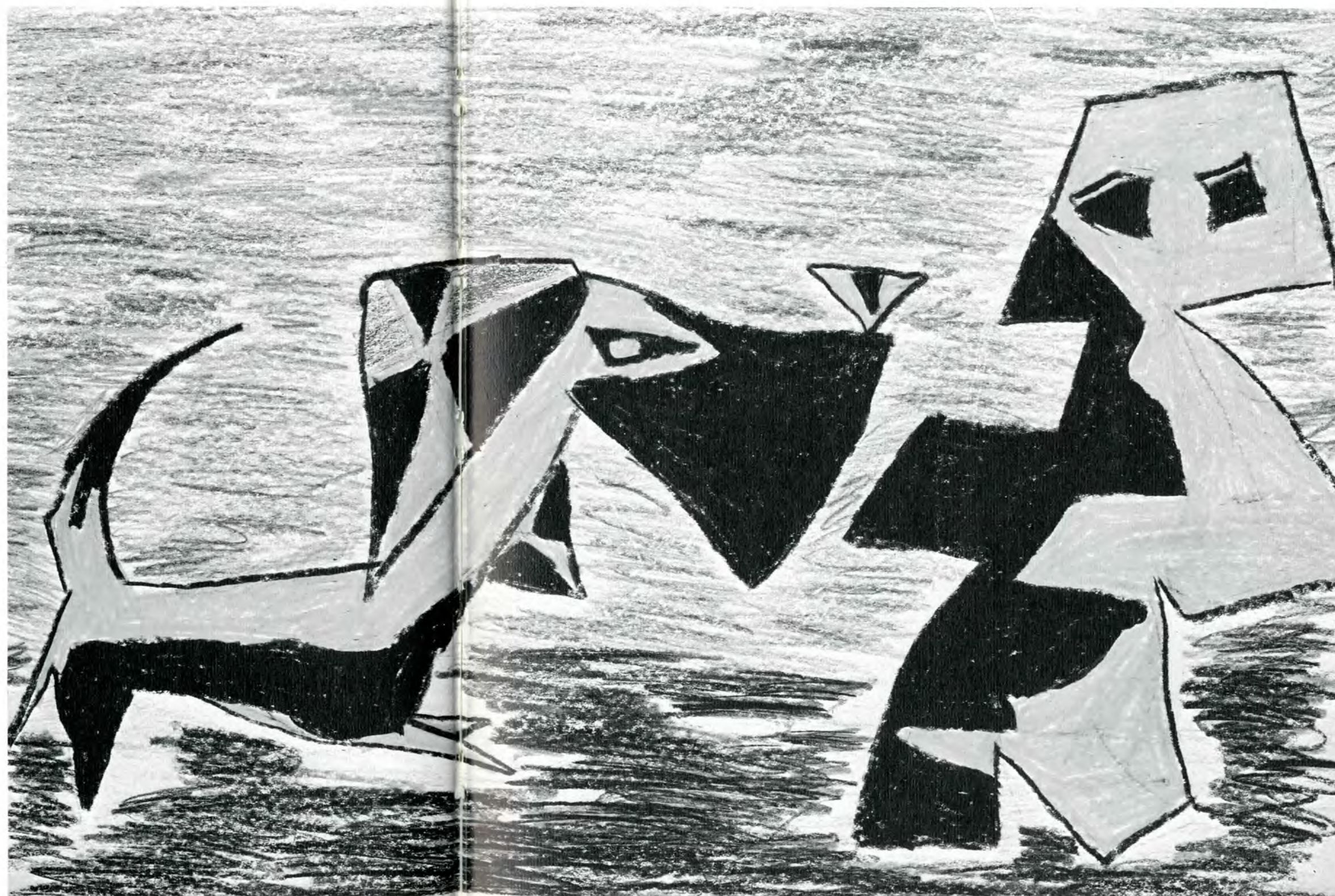
