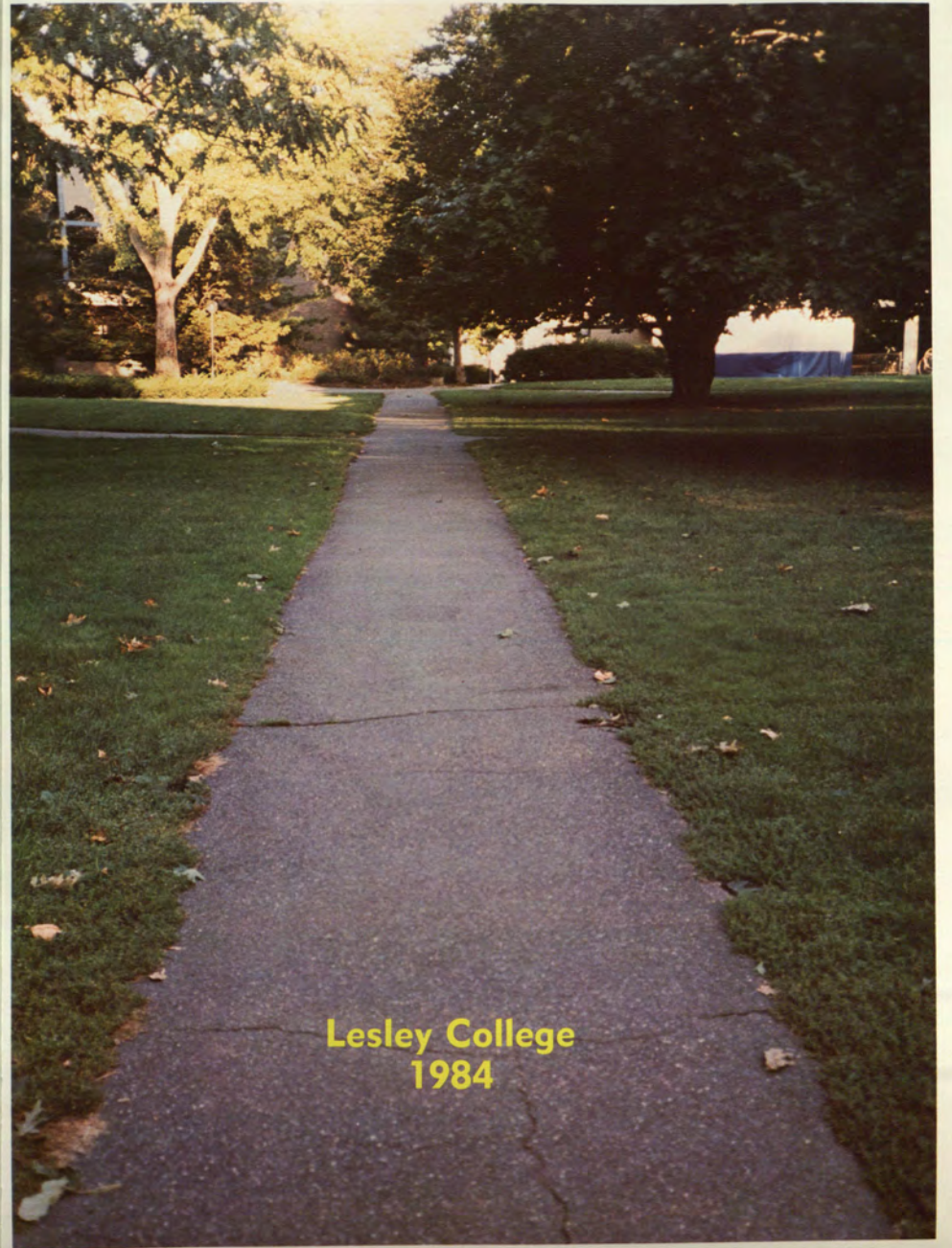

From those of us who open our hearts to others, to those individuals who have opened their hearts to us, we wish to express our love and gratitude.



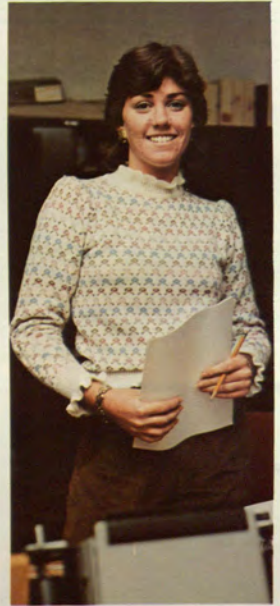
