Senior Investiture

The traditional Undergraduate School Senior Investiture ceremony was held on Friday evening October 4th at the First Church in Cambridge. This was an important milestone for seniors and provided an opportunity for family, friends, and members of the Lesley community to gather in their honor.









As the weeks have gone by since this semester began and this day came closer and closer, I realized what a difficult task. I had let myself in for by accepting this honor. Last May, I sought out last year's Senior Investiture speaker, Karen Lavey, and asked her advice on what I should say. She calmly told me, "just say what's in your heart." At the time, I must admit, that sounded like a wonderful piece of wisdom, but now that the moment of truth has arrived, my heart has other ideas. To describe the emotions I feel now in words, about this, our final year, would probably come out all jumbled.

Through them, he gains an understanding of the reason behind his burning ambitions, and most importantly of all, he uses his new-found wisdom to teach the others around him that it's okay to be different.

Through this story, I want you all to realize that you each have that same drive within you. Of that there can be no doubt, for to have chosen the professions you have, there exists in you a zeal to bring out the best in others by giving the best of yourselves. You all have that intangible gift for which no words can be found - the gift not only of giving of yourselves, but giving of yourselves for the betterment of others. This is a very precious and wonderful gift you possess, and in my own way, this is what I wish to give you today to keep with you for your lives ahead. I give you your beautiful selves—whole, intact and budding, waiting anxiously for life's touch so that you may bloom to your full potential. The treasures you hold within you are great - don't be ashamed of them. Let others have the honor and benefit of experiencing your uniqueness - for I firmly believe that there are no others like you. When the going gets tough during the course of this year or in future years, remember and believe in what I have just told you for it is all true.

I leave you with this quote from Richard Bach, "Don't believe what your eyes are telling you. All they show is limitation. Look with your understanding, find out what you already know, and you'll see the way to fly."
