





Lesley was our home away from home. That feeling had nothing to do with where we lived but with whom we lived. We depended on each other.









66 Be productive, be creative, be passionate about something or make or create something. You've just got to be you with all of your heart." These were the inspirational words of artist Denny Dent.

Saying Goodbye

Before I begin, I would like to thank the class of 1993 for giving me this honor. I would also like to thank all of the faculty who have helped us along the way. But most of all, I would like to thank all of our friends and family for being here tonight and for giving us so much support throughout the years. Thank you to all.

This is the hardest speech that I've ever had to write. No paper in the last three years compares with this speech. Mary Norberg told me to write what's in my heart, but she didn't tell me what to do if what's in my heart is enough to fill ten pages. I've been spending a lot of time thinking about what I was going to say tonight. I guess I've always known what I was going to say, I just didn't know how. I've never liked saying goodbye.

As I was thinking about how to say goodbye, I thought about all that we have experienced, together, here at Lesley. These past few years have been very special and unique. We will never again be undergraduate Freshmen. We will never again sit up until one a.m. and order out together. We will never again cram for tests together. All of you in the audience may be thinking, who would want that again? It's not that we want to be Freshmen or cram for tests all over again. It's just that we're going to miss doing those things together.

Thinking about all of that made me a little sad. But then I thought, after we graduate we can change the world together, we can make a difference together, and one day we'll have a reunion and then we can sit in our rooms, talk until one a.m. and order out together, all over again. I guess what I'm saying is this is a goodbye speech but this goodbye is not forever. There's so much more of life to live and I know that it's going to be good. Being able to carry all of the friendships we've made and the experiences we've had with us, will only make it that much better.

You are a very special group of young women. I'm very glad that I got the chance to spend this short amount of time with you. In a way, I wish we had more time together, but in my heart I know that more time wouldn't make our experience better because we have had the best.

I would like to leave you with a poem by Ralph Waldo Emerson. It's called, "How Do You Measure Success?"

'To laugh often and much. To win the respect of intelligent people and the affection of children. To earn the appreciation of honest critics and to endure the betrayal of false friends. To appreciate beauty. To find the best in others. To leave the world a bit better, whether by a child, a garden patch, a redeemed social condition or a job well done. To know even one other life has breathed easier because you have lived ... This is to have succeeded!'

You, Class of 1993, are some of the most successful people I have ever met. Keep growing, keep succeeding, and in essence keep being yourselves. Thank you.

Highlights from the Senior Investiture Speech 1992

First off, let me dispense with protocol and welcome all of you to Senior Investiture, this academic rite of passage, and especially to welcome and congratulate the Senior class of 1993. Thank you for having chosen me as your faculty speaker, and thanks to President McKenna for lending me a legal hood.

Tonight, for the first time, all of you and all of us, those who occupy the other side of the desk, are meeting in an equal level of disguise or costume, and I use the word disguise, since without my doctoral robes no one on the street or on the subway would know my vocation, the same way in May no one will know you have graduated from Lesley College, except to see you in your robes, or perhaps to see the look of relief on your faces.

We are not the first women to attempt careers/vocations in a world whose original scholars were men, yet in the Judeo-Christian tradition it is Eve who is tempted to eat from the Tree of Knowledge of Good and Evil in order to think like God. What would have happened if the serpent had talked to Adam? We might still be in Eden doing very little besides naming animals and staring at the two forbidden trees. So, if women did and do desire knowledge and were not allowed to think/work in male professions, although they were tempted; the solution would be to dress and act like men, to disguise themselves in order to infiltrate the male world and its professions.

We do not live in a magical place, but in the real city, and I am certainly not telling you that by putting on black academician's robes, with your well earned degrees, you are going to "make right" a troubled world. My message is simple, I hope that I have been a good teacher, and that in your four years at Lestey you have learned how to join and change a world which has better places for women than the ones offered to our 15th century counterparts: now you can be a Doctor of Law, a Doctor of Letters, a Doctor of Medicine, a Doctor of Philosophy, a Doctor of Education, a Master of Arts, the list is very long, and play a part in working for a better future, while not having to disguise yourself, at least not farther than these robes which we do not wear very often.

I leave you with two thoughts:

One: That on November 3rd you exercise your right to vote in the Presidential election, because voting is a privilege that has not always been ours, and Two; that you allow me to play dramaturg and change two words in Shylock's speech. I've inserted the word woman to replace Jew and the word man to replace Christian.

I am a woman. Hath not a woman eyes?

Hath not a woman hands, organs, dimensions, senses, affections, passions; fed with the same food, hurt by the same weapons, subject to the same diseases, healed by the same means, warm'd and cool'd by the same winter and summer as man is?

If you prick us do we not bleed? If you tickle us, do we not laugh? If you poison us, do we not die? And if you wrong us, shall we not revenge?

If we, are like you on the rest, we will resemble you in that. If a woman wrong a man, what is her humility? Revenge.

If a man wrong a woman - what should his sufferance be?


